The most famous ancient myth about the olive tree is the one that considers the tree a gift of ancient Greek goddess <u>Athena</u>, the goddess of Wisdom. It all started with the dispute between Athena and Poseidon, god-ruler of the Sea. The winner of this competition would be the one whose contribution would be valuable to the city. <u>Poseidon</u> lifted his trident and nailed it to the sacred rock of <u>the Acropolis</u>. Salt water began to gush and flow to the roots of the rock. While Athena planted an olive tree. Within a short time it had sprouted and its silver-green foliage had impressed everyone. That was it. Such a tree did not exist until then in the world. Now, people could enjoy precious oil in their cooked food, or they could enjoy an illuminated night, since the oil became the most advanced lighting medium of the time. The other gods considered Athena's gift to be priceless and the city was named after goddess Athena, Athens.



Today the cultivation of olives is very widespread in Greece and the consumption of the fruit and the olive oil is a key element of a healthy diet, the famous Mediterranean diet.



The olive wreath, also known as kotinos (Greek: $\kappa \acute{o} \tau i vo \varsigma$), was the prize for the winner at the ancient Olympic Games.





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


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4. Other facts
